

September 4, 1947 First Contact: A lett

First Contact: A letter from J. H. McCann (Pi Kappa Phi) to Mr. William Hazell, Jr., Associate Dean, Newark College of Engineering (*Sigma Pi Alum, future NCE President*), thanking him for the previous evenings meeting discussing fraternities at NCE. "I shall await with interest your advise as to the attitude of Phi Sigma Omega toward development of a contact with Pi Kappa Phi."

November 1947

A letter from Phi Sigma Omega, Beta Chapter, to all graduate brothers of the chapter informing them of discussions with Pi Kappa Phi, listing eight major points of that meeting and asking for their opinion. The eighth point was: "At the meeting the undergraduate brothers and present officers voted in favor of nationalization, but before a final step in either for or against is taken, a survey of the opinion of the alumni would be made and considered in matter."

February 4, 1948

A letter from W. Bernard Jones, Jr., Executive Secretary of Pi Kappa Phi to Mr. William Hazell, Jr., "I note from our correspondence on the matter that you have been very helpful to our Mr. McCann concerning the possibility of the Phi Sigma Omega Fraternity's being nationalized by us. We have just received a petition from this group and would like a statement from your office about whether this would be approved by the School Administration...."

February 7, 1948

A letter from Will E. Edington, National Scholarship Chairman, Pi Kappa Phi to Registrar of NCE requesting the grades of each of the men of Phi Sigma Omega.

February 9, 1948

A letter from Mr. William Hazell, Jr. to Mr. W. Bernard Jones, Jr. Acknowledging NCE approval of Phi Sigma Omega to nationalize.

February 27, 1948

A letter from Mr. William Hazell, Jr. to Dr. Will E. Edington providing grade point averages for the brothers of Phi Sigma Omega.

March 26, 1948

A letter from Charles W. Martin, Traveling Counselor, Pi Kappa Phi to Mr. William Hazell, Jr. requesting he write a letter to a Mr. Embury of the National Interfraternity Conference regarding the national status of Phi Sigma Omega.

April 9, 1948

Mr. William Hazell, Jr. writes to Mr. Embury of the National Interfraternity To confirm the NIC's opinion on national vs local status.

April 12, 1948

Mr. Embury of the National Interfraternity Conference writes to Mr. William Hazell, Jr. acknowledging receipt of his letter and stating that he had recommended the application of Pi Kappa Phi absorbing Phi Sigma Omega be approved by the Executive Committee of the N.I.C.

May 6, 1948

Announcement sent to all Phi Sigma Omega graduate brothers announcing the chapters decision to join Pi Kappa Phi, as well as the dates times and cost of the ceremonies:

Pi Kappa Phi Goes To New Jersey

ON the twenty-ninth of May, nineteen hundred forty-eight another milestone was written into the history of Pi Kappa Phi Fraternity, with the installation of Beta Alpha Chapter at Newark College of Engineering, Newark, N. J. The ceremonies were conducted in the Hotel Essex House in Newark. This occasion marked the beginning of the third trip through the Greek alphabet in the naming of chapters and the first time in over ten years that Pi Kappa Phi has absorbed a local fraternity as one of its chapters.

Early in 1947 the local fraternity Phi Sigma Omega passed a resolution to look into national fraternities with the ultimate aim of being absorbed by one of them. After some preliminary investigation the matter was shelved for action during the next school year. During the early fall of that year, through the offices of William Hazell, Associate Dean, members of Phi Sigma Omega were put in contact with Brother Jack McCann. After several subsequent meetings with brothers of Pi Kappa Phi, including District Archon John

Stevens and Travelling Counsellor Charles Martin, the local petitioned the national council to be admitted into Pi Kappa Phi as a chapter. The council accepted this petition and immediately plans got under way for the installation of Beta Alpha Chapter.

Brother George Dib very ably "M.C.'d" the banquet which was held after the completion of initiation and installation ceremonies. Brothers from Alpha Upsilon, Alpha Mu, Alpha Tau and Alpha Xi as well as alumni in the area and friends of the new

chapter were among the guests. Among the speakers were Dean Hazell, who welcomed Pi Kappa Phi to the campus in behalf of the college, and Executive Secretary, W. Bernard Jones, Jr., National Historian, John W. Deimler, and District Archon, John Stevens, who were the officiating men at the installation.

The following officers were elected to steer the course of Beta Alpha's initial activities: Alfred Taboada, archon; Michael Bravette, treasurer; Frank Cozzarelli, secretary; Kort A. Gorshkoff, historian; James Gomes, chaplain; and William Schlosser, warden. Professor George Keefe was appointed chapter adviser of the group.

Newark College of Engineering, like Drexel and Brooklyn Poly, is an urban college in the asphalt campus class, being situated very close to the center of Newark, New Jersey. The little bit of clear ground that there was has recently disappeared

under the construction work of the addition to the laboratory building. The college is expanding in other ways, also. A recent purchase of real estate from the City of Newark has made the college the dubious owner of an orphanage. This building has been the Newark Orphan Asylum for a great number of years and a landmark with a tower overlooking the city. Renamed Eberhardt Hall it will house the offices, a proposed cafeteria, and other activities long missing at the school due to lack of space.

The city commission of Newark passed a resolution commending the college for its work on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the first graduating class of the twenty-nine year old school. There are about 1400 students enrolled in the day school and 1300 more attending the night

school and the special courses of Newark Technical School, which was formed in 1885 and out of which the college grew. Technically a co-educational institution, the feminine section of the student body rarely has more than one or two girls per class. This is due to the fact that N. C. E. is an engineering college giving B.S. degrees in the four branches of the profession; mechanical, chemical, electrical, and civil. The new graduate school will present the first M.S. degrees next June. Of the seven fraternities on the campus there are now six nationals represented.

Beta Alpha wishes to thank Alpha Xi for the swell job their initiating team did in installing the new member of the family and showing it the way on the road of friendship and fraternity.






